

APPRAISER RENEWAL 2011

The Board will mail renewal notices to licensees on/or about November 1, 2011.

To renew an appraiser license this year you will need 14 hours of Board approved continuing education.

A 7 hour USPAP is required only in an even year renewal. However, if you have not taken the 7 hour USPAP course since 2009, you will need to take it both this year and next year.

All courses taken for your 2011 renewal must have been taken between January 1, 2011 and the date you renew your license.

Do not renew your license until you have all of your course completion certificates in your hand.

Do not send course completion certificates to the office unless you have been audited by the board.

The Board will mail audit notices in February. If you are audited, that is when you mail in your course completion certificates.

The Maine Board allows only those courses that have been approved by the Appraisal Foundation. Below is the link to the Appraisal Foundation's Course Approval Program (CAP). THIS IS THE BOARD'S STATUTE REGARDING CONTINUING EDUCATION:

32 §14027. CONTINUING EDUCATION

1. Requirement. As a prerequisite to renewal of a license, an applicant must have completed the minimum hour requirements for continuing education in programs or courses approved by the appraiser qualifications board, which must include a 7-hour national uniform standards of professional appraisal practice update course completed in the even-numbered year as part of license renewal.

Chapter 220: EDUCATIONAL COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Summary: This chapter requires that qualifying education and continuing education be approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board.

2. Continuing Education

Continuing education programs and courses must be submitted for review and approval to the Appraiser Qualifications Board under the criteria established by the Appraiser Qualifications Board. The Board of Real Estate Appraisers will not recognize continuing education programs and courses that are not approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board.
